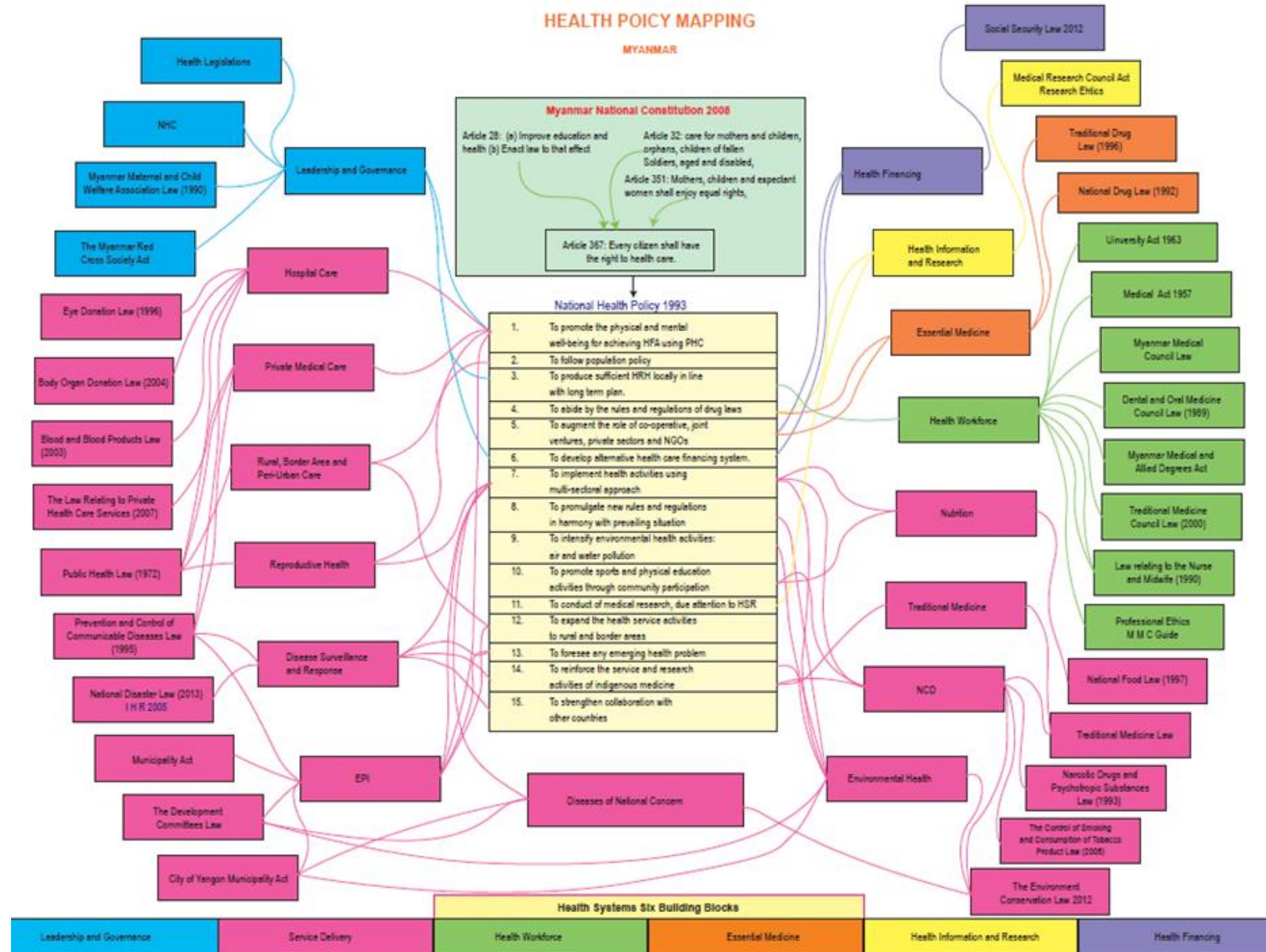

# Policy Vision and Mission

- ▶ **Vision:** A healthier nation that contributes to its economic, social, mental and spiritual development
- ▶ **Mission:** *Contribute to social and economic development of the Union of Myanmar by achieving the highest attainable health status through effective and efficient promotive, preventive, curative, rehabilitative and palliative services of high quality made available and accessible to all the people in an equitable approach, with special emphasis to vulnerable, hard-to-reach and ethnic minority.'*

# Policy Goal, Objectives and Orientations

- ▶ **Goal** : *Attain the highest possible standard of health and well being of entire population at all ages by 2030, in a responsive manner.*
- ▶ **Targets**: *To attain a level of health status as aspired in Myanmar Health Vision 2030, global commitment of Sustainable Development Agenda 2030 and aligning with the aims of Myanmar Sustainable Development Plan (MSDP).*

► *Overall Policy Objectives :*

- *To attain universal coverage of critical services that positively contribute to the realization of the policy goal. The essential health services attaining the needs of the population should reach to all, leaving no one behind, adhering to objective quality standards and applying evidence-informed interventions through resilient health system.*

# Policy Objectives and Key Priority Strategies

## ► Health Services

1. Improved reproductive, maternal, new-borns, child and adolescent health services;
2. *Improved Elderly Health Care Services*
3. Reduced prevalence of communicable diseases;
4. Halt the rising burden of non-communicable diseases and mental disorders;
5. Efficient emergency preparedness and response;
6. Improved access to essential health care services , inclusive of traditional medicine services;
7. Ensured health safety - patient, drug, medical devices, cosmetics
8. Minimized exposure to health risk factors;
9. Realized exercise is health;

# Policy Objectives

## ► Intersectoral Collaboration

1. Reduced malnutrition;
2. Sustained water safety, sanitation, hygiene and food safety
3. Sustained occupational health services;
4. Sustained environmental pollution control and climate change services
5. *Promote health through schools/academic institutions*

## ► Partnership in Health

1. Strengthened Community Participation;
2. Strengthened Public Private Partnership;
3. Strengthened partnership with international partners in health.

# Policy Orientations

## 1. Organized Service Delivery

- Attain universal coverage of high-quality package of essential health services

## 2. Leadership and Governance

- Ensuring strategic guidance and oversight in the regulation and implementation of all health-related services

## 3. Health Workforce

- Aspire for an adequate, competent and equitable distribution of a productive health workforce that is responsive to changing health needs.

# Policy Orientations

## 4. Health Financing

- Secure health financing that fosters universal health coverage through ensuring conformance to coherent health financing strategy to guide long term investments in the health sector at National, State/Region and Township level.

## 5. Health Products and Technologies

- Ensure the availability of medicines, vaccines and other medical products and technologies, which are appropriate, safe, efficacious and qualified, to who need them, at a time they need them, and also ensure the rational use of medicines, vaccines and blood products.

# Policy Orientations

## 6. Health Information

- Ensure in providing complete, accurate, reliable and timely health information for making the right decision at the right time to ensure an equitable, effective, efficient and responsive health system

## 7. Health infrastructure

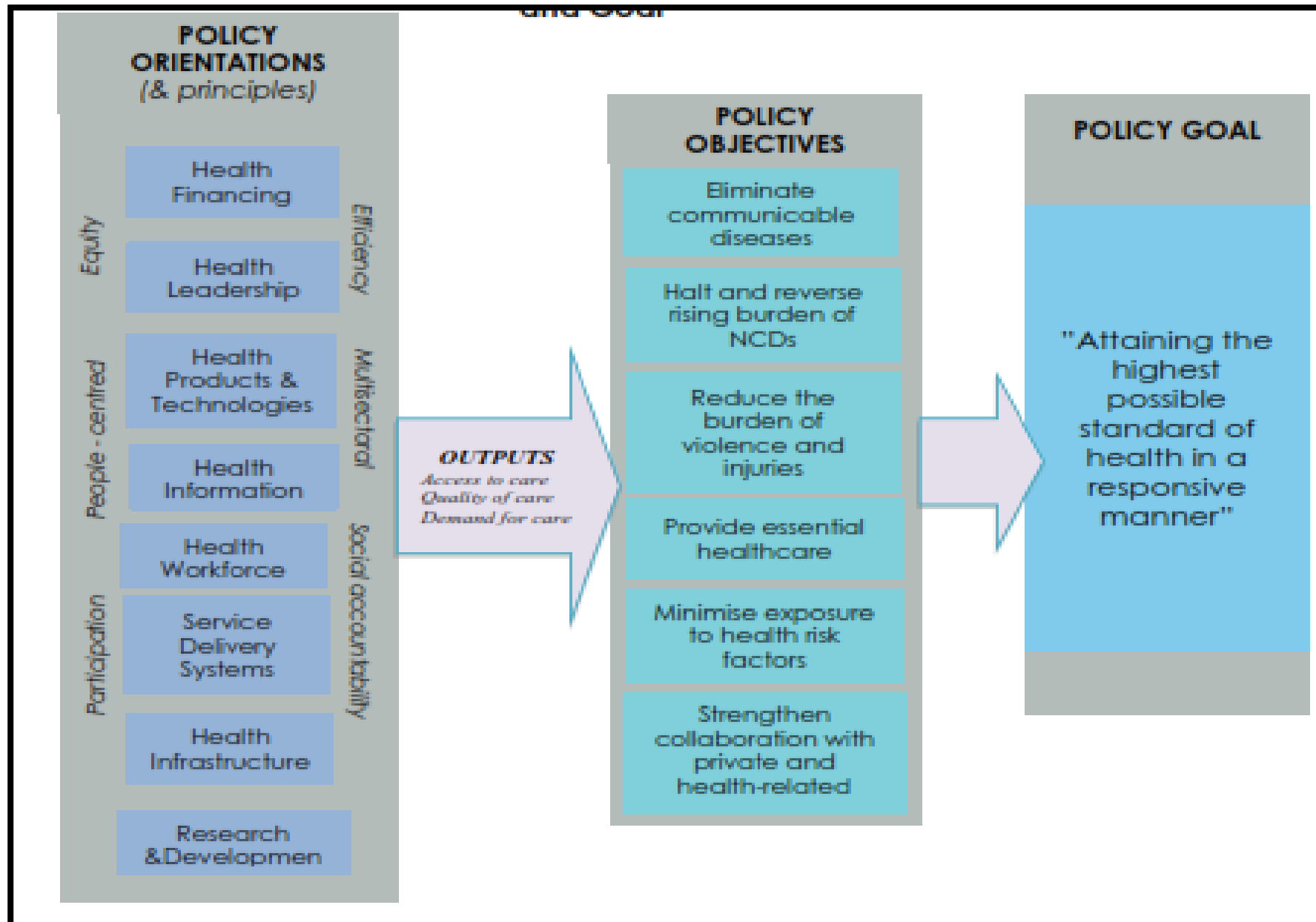
- Ensure adequate and appropriate health infrastructure

# Monitoring and Evaluation

- ▶ **Monitoring and Evaluation Framework**
- ▶ **Progress Indicators**
  - ▶ The policy plan period is for ten years
  - ▶ will be implemented on three-year basis, and
  - ▶ the last year will be a space to catch-up the gap,
  - ▶ Joint review missions, preceded by the technical reviews, biennium
  - ▶ will be conducted to assess the performance and will involve all the stakeholders.

# Monitoring and Evaluation(Contd.)

- ▶ At the first review mission, priorities for the year will be identified while the second review mission will assess the progress being made.
- ▶ At every three year, a comprehensive assessment will be undertaken to assess progress made towards the set goals of Objectives and Orientations of the policy, and to inform intervention measures for the remainder of the plan period.
- ▶ The last assessment at the end of the ninth year will undergo a final evaluation to assess the achievements made towards the policy implementation.
