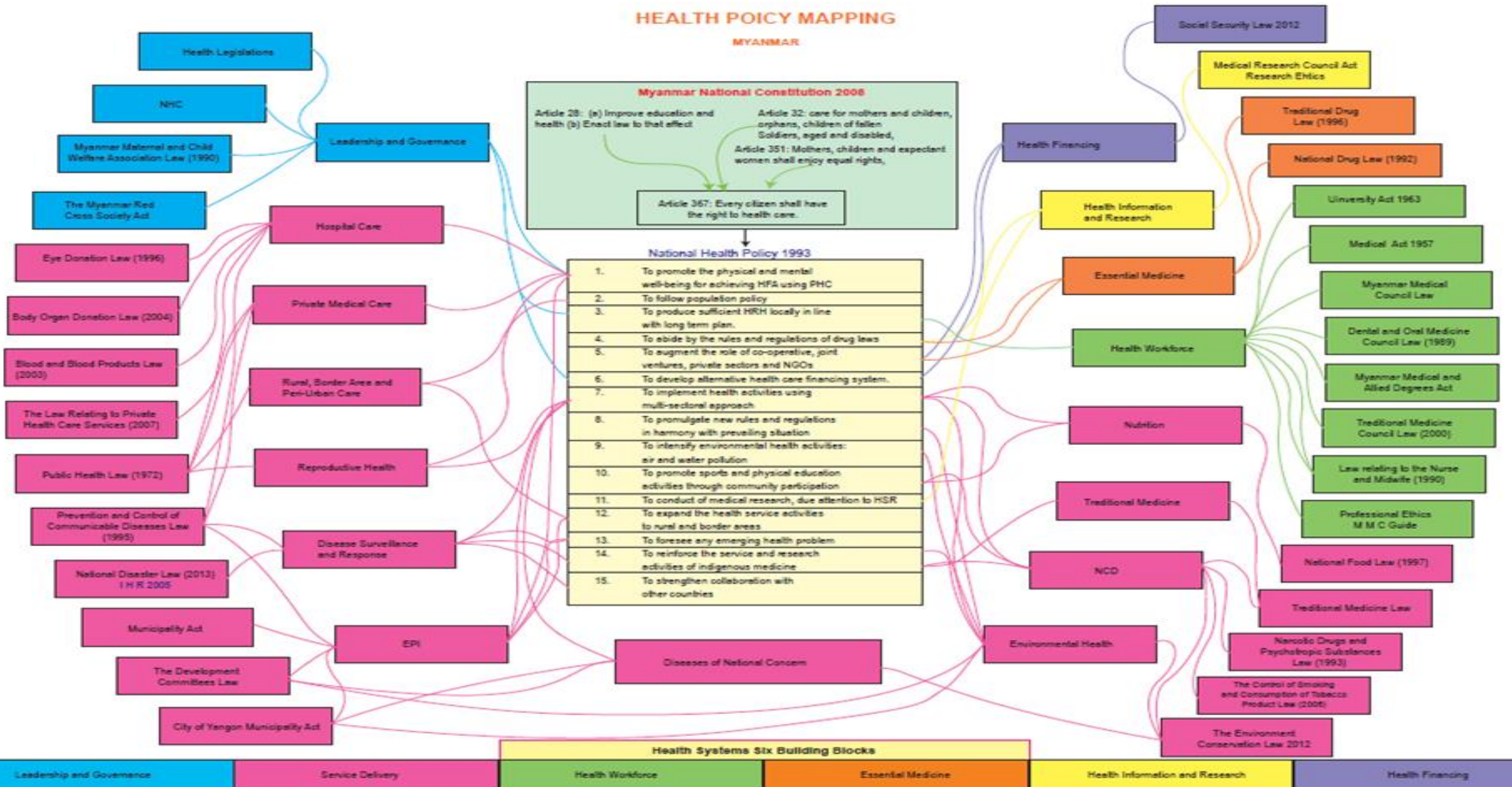

Policy Goal, Objectives and Orientation

- **Goal** : *Achieve the highest possible standard of health status of entire population at all ages by 2030, in a responsive manner.*
- **Targets**: *To attain a level of health status as aspired in Myanmar Health Vision 2030, global commitment of Sustainable Development Agenda 2030 and aligning with the aims of MSDP.*



Overall Policy Objectives

- Attain universal coverage of critical services that positively contribute to the realization of the policy goal. The essential health services attaining the needs of the population should reach to all, leaving no one behind, adhering to objective quality standards and applying evidence-informed interventions through resilient health system



Policy Objectives

Health Services

1. **Improved reproductive, maternal, new-borns, child and adolescent health services:** *Ensured reduction of maternal and infant mortalities and morbidities through effective delivery of sexual and reproductive health services and provision of quality services to adolescent*
2. **Improved Elderly Health Care Services:** *Strengthened support for the elderly in provision of age-friendly health facilities with emphasis on detection and treatment of chronic diseases and promoting healthy lifestyles..*
3. **Halt the rising burden of non-communicable diseases and mental disorders:** *Ensured reduction of mortality and morbidity due to noncommunicable diseases, including mental disorders through establishment of health promotion, treatment, rehabilitation intervention and creating awareness of risk factors.*



Policy Objectives

Health Services

4. **Minimized exposure to health risk factors:** *Strengthened health promotion intervention, facilitating a healthy lifestyle*
5. **Realized exercise is health :** *Encouraged daily moderate physical activity, contributing to positive health to all including active ageing.*
6. **Reduced prevalence of communicable diseases:** *Ensured the reduction of morbidity and mortality of priority communicable diseases, halting the epidemic situation and bringing the vaccine preventable diseases and vector borne diseases under control.*
7. **Attained efficient emergency preparedness and response:** *Strengthened emergency preparedness and response capability for International Health Regulation, disaster risk reduction, prompt response, and recovery as a means to mitigate impact of adverse events.*



Policy Objectives

Health Services

8. Improved access to essential health care services, inclusive of traditional and alternative medicine
services: Strengthened service delivery of quality essential health care services, inclusive of traditional and alternative medicine services, with special emphasis in addressing access and equity, reaching to all
9. Ensured Patient safety: *'Strengthened the patient-centred approach in health care, promoting patient safety culture, including hospital infection control*
10. Ensured food, drug, medical devices and cosmetic safety: *Ensured the protection of the health of the consumers ensuring all food, drug, medical devices and cosmetic produced in or imported into the country, for placing into the market, to be safe for human consumption and usage.*



Policy Objectives

Partnership in Health

1. Strengthened and sustained active Community Participation and Ownership

- *Strengthened people-centred approach, ensuring the effective utilization of resources in journey towards universal health coverage*

2. Strengthened Public Private Partnership (PPP)

- *Strengthened the provision of health services with a clear understanding in close coordination and collaboration between public and private sector*

3. Strengthened partnership with Development Partners in Health

- *Strengthened the close collaboration with all developmental partners in health observing the five principles of Aid Effectiveness*

Policy Orientations

- **Organized Service Delivery:** *Attain universal coverage of high-quality package of essential health services*
- **Leadership and Governance :** *Strengthened strategic guidance and oversight in the regulation and implementation of all health-related services*
- **Health Workforce:** *Ensured adequate, competent and productive health workforce that is responsive to changing health needs within an effective, efficient and equitable health system.*
- **Health Financing:** *Secured health financing that fosters universal health coverage through ensuring conformance to coherent health financing strategy to guide long term investments in the health sector at National, State/Region and Township level*

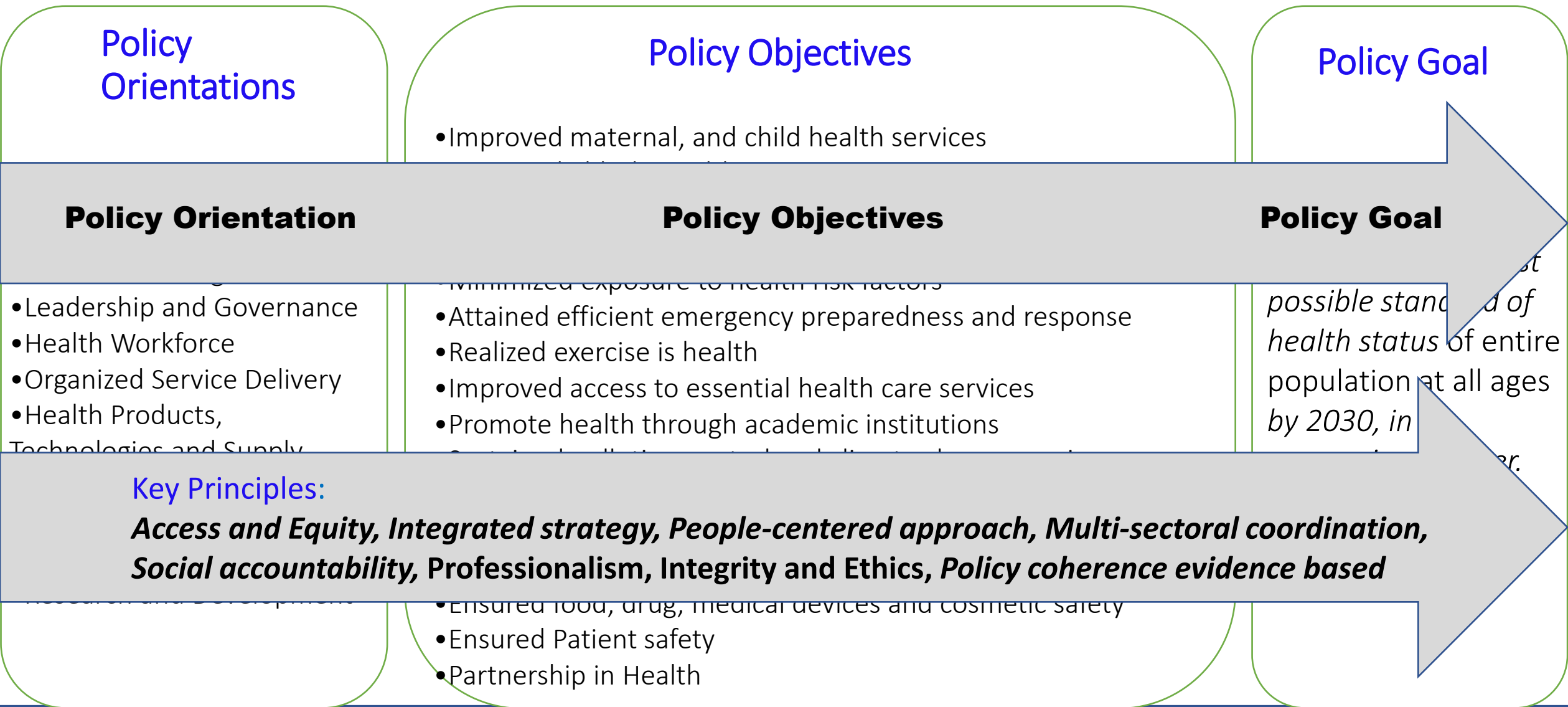


Policy Orientations

- **Health Products, Technologies and Supply Chain Management:** *Ensured the availability of medicines, vaccines and other medical products and technologies, which are appropriate, safe, efficacious and qualified, to who need them, at a time they need them, and also ensure the rational use of medicines, vaccines and blood products*
- **Health Information System:** *Streamlined in providing complete, accurate, reliable and timely health information for making the right decision at the right time ensuring an equitable, effective, efficient and responsive health system*
- **Health infrastructure:** *Ensured adequate and appropriate health infrastructure*
- **Research and Development:** *Strengthened evidence-based policy making process for overall health development*

Monitoring and Evaluation

- Progress Indicators
 - The policy plan period is for ten years
 - will be implemented on three-year basis, and
 - the last year will be a space to catch-up the gap
 - Joint review missions, preceded by the technical reviews, biennium
 - will be conducted to assess the performance and will involve all the stakeholders



Monitoring and Evaluation(Contd.)

- At the first review mission, priorities for the year will be identified while the second review mission will assess the progress being made.
- At every three year, a comprehensive assessment will be undertaken to assess progress made towards the set goals of Objectives and Orientations of the policy, and to inform intervention measures for the remainder of the plan period.
- The last assessment at the end of the ninth year will undergo a final evaluation to assess the achievements made towards the policy implementation.



Current Status and Way Forward

- Central Steering Committee – two times conducted
- Advisory Committee Meeting – two times conducted
- Working Group and Core Group Meeting – 6 times conducted
- Multi-Stakeholders Consultation Meetings
 - Two Times in December (17/18 Dec)
 - First – Meeting with All State/Region Health Departments/MS/PMs/Basic Health Professionals (17-12-19)
 - Second – Meeting with Professional Councils and Associations, UN Agencies, Donors, INGOs, NGOs, EHOs and CSOs (18-12-19)
 - Plan to be Launched in Jan/Feb 2020
