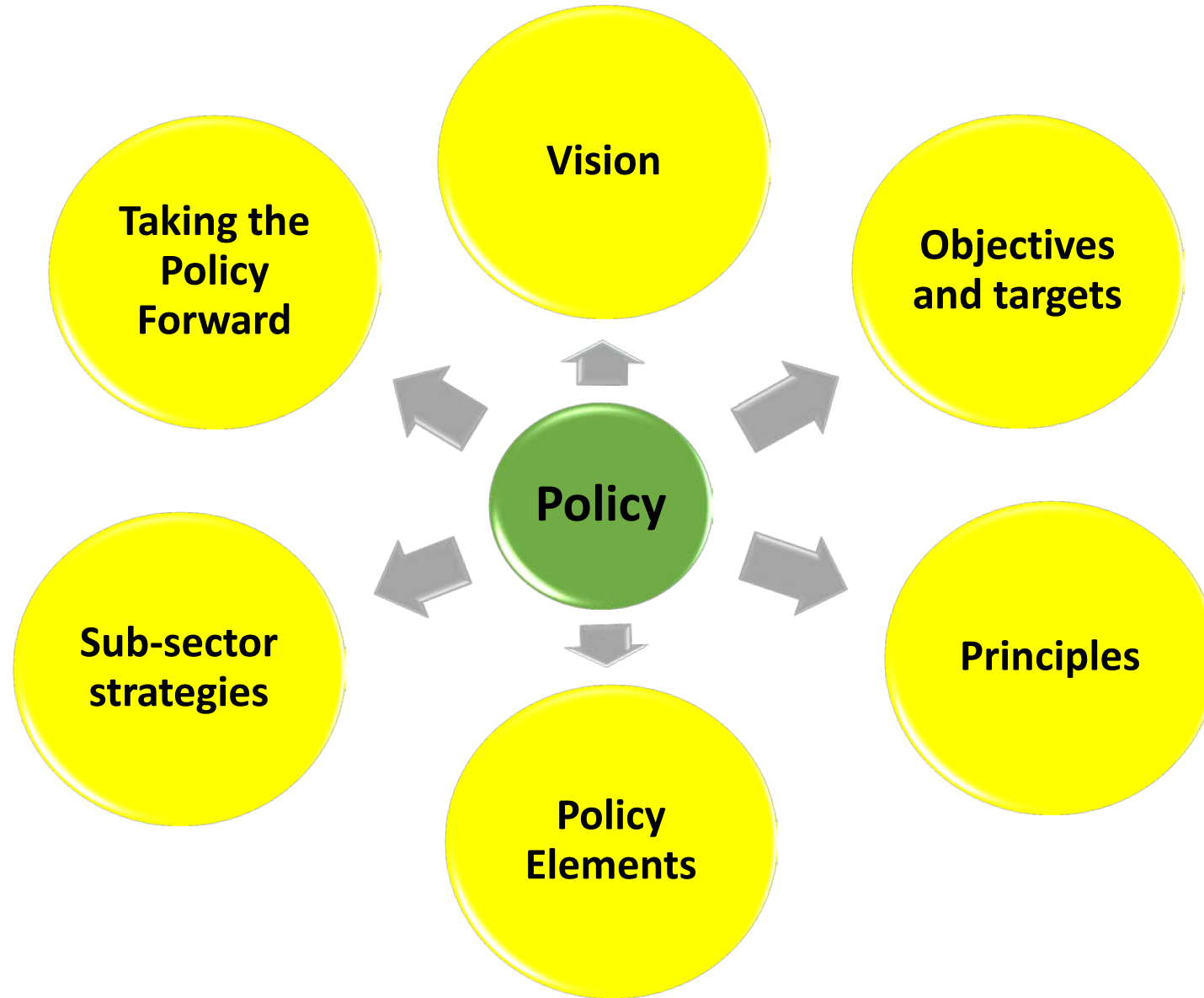

Rationale for a policy

- Sanitation Impacts multiple development indicators
- Policy helps in:
 - Prioritize sanitation and hygiene.
 - set an Enabling environment
 - Institutional clarity, along with responsibilities, define the incentives
 - Implementation of sustainable program.

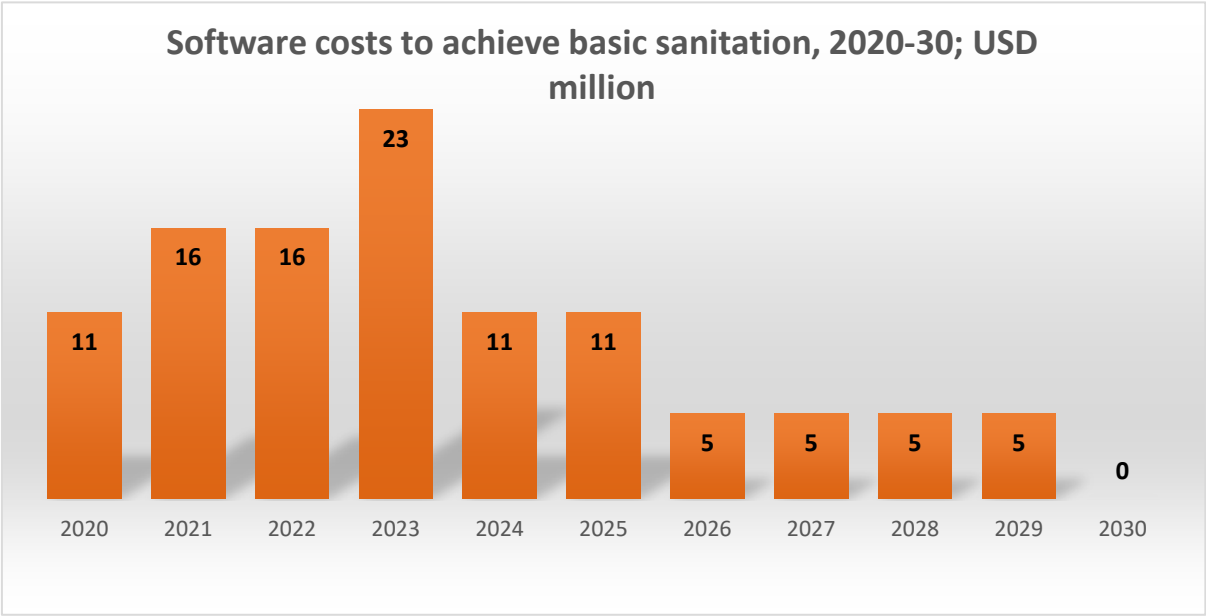
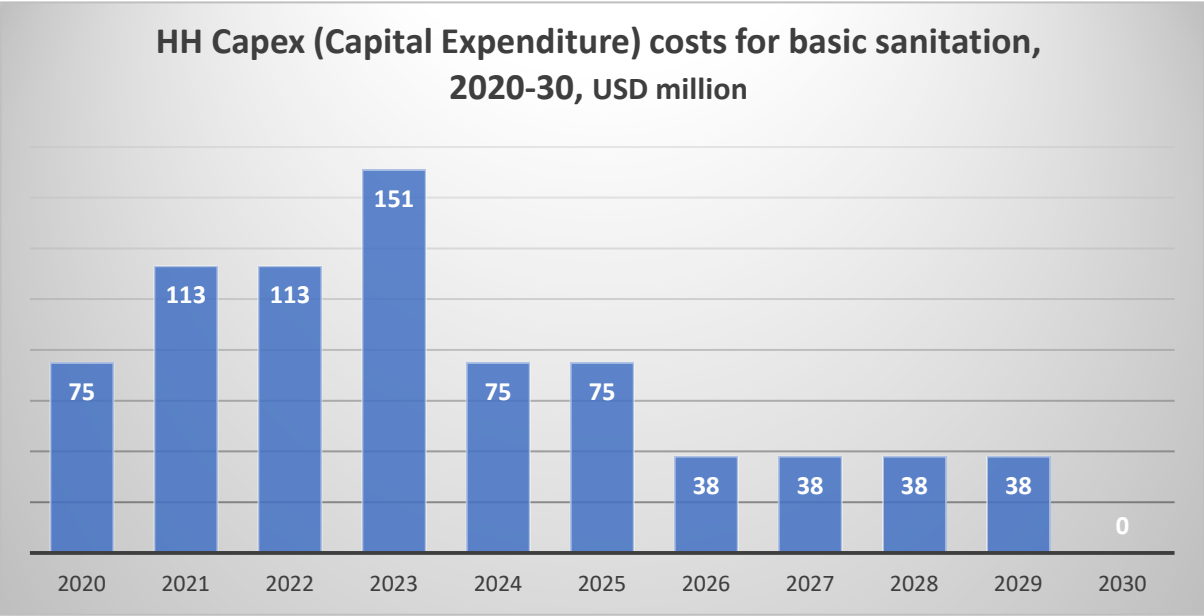
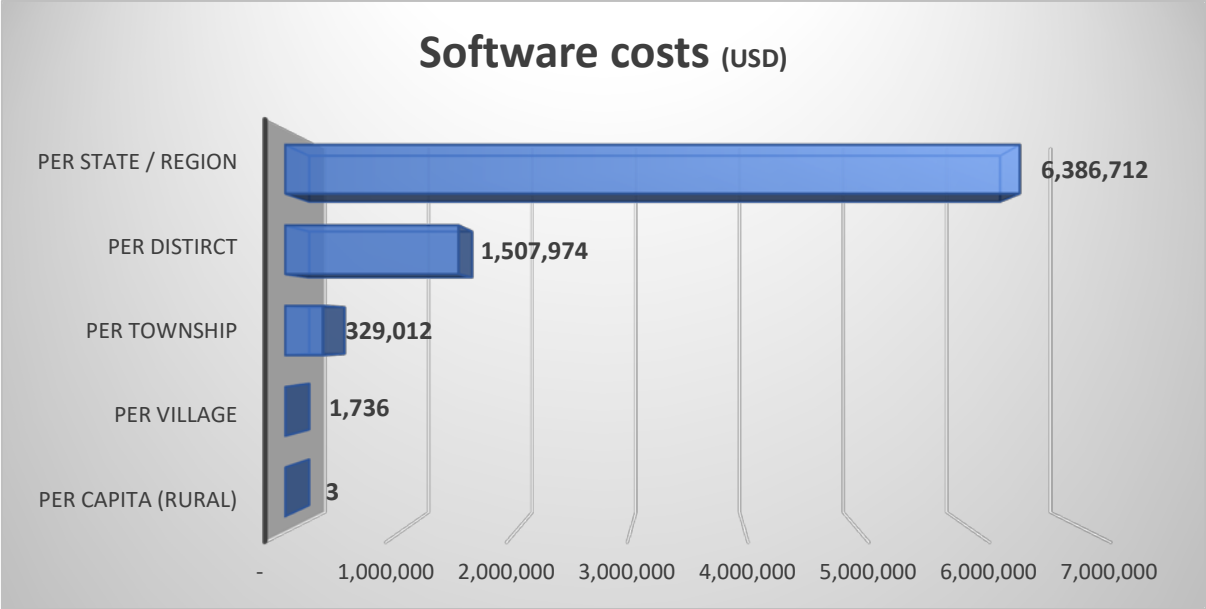
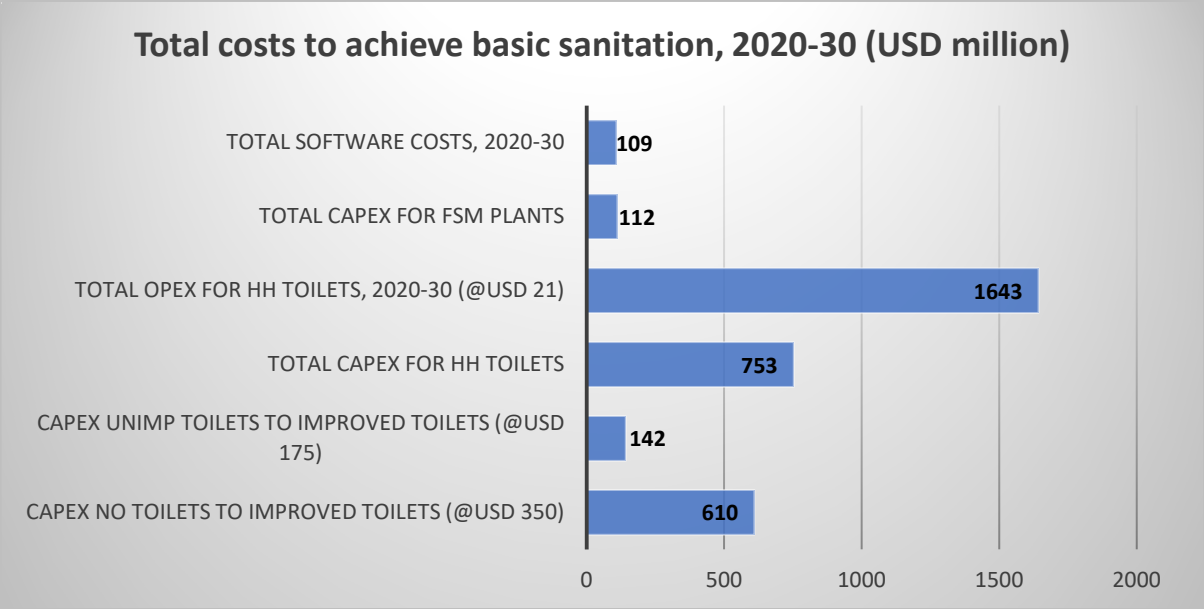
Vision for the Sector

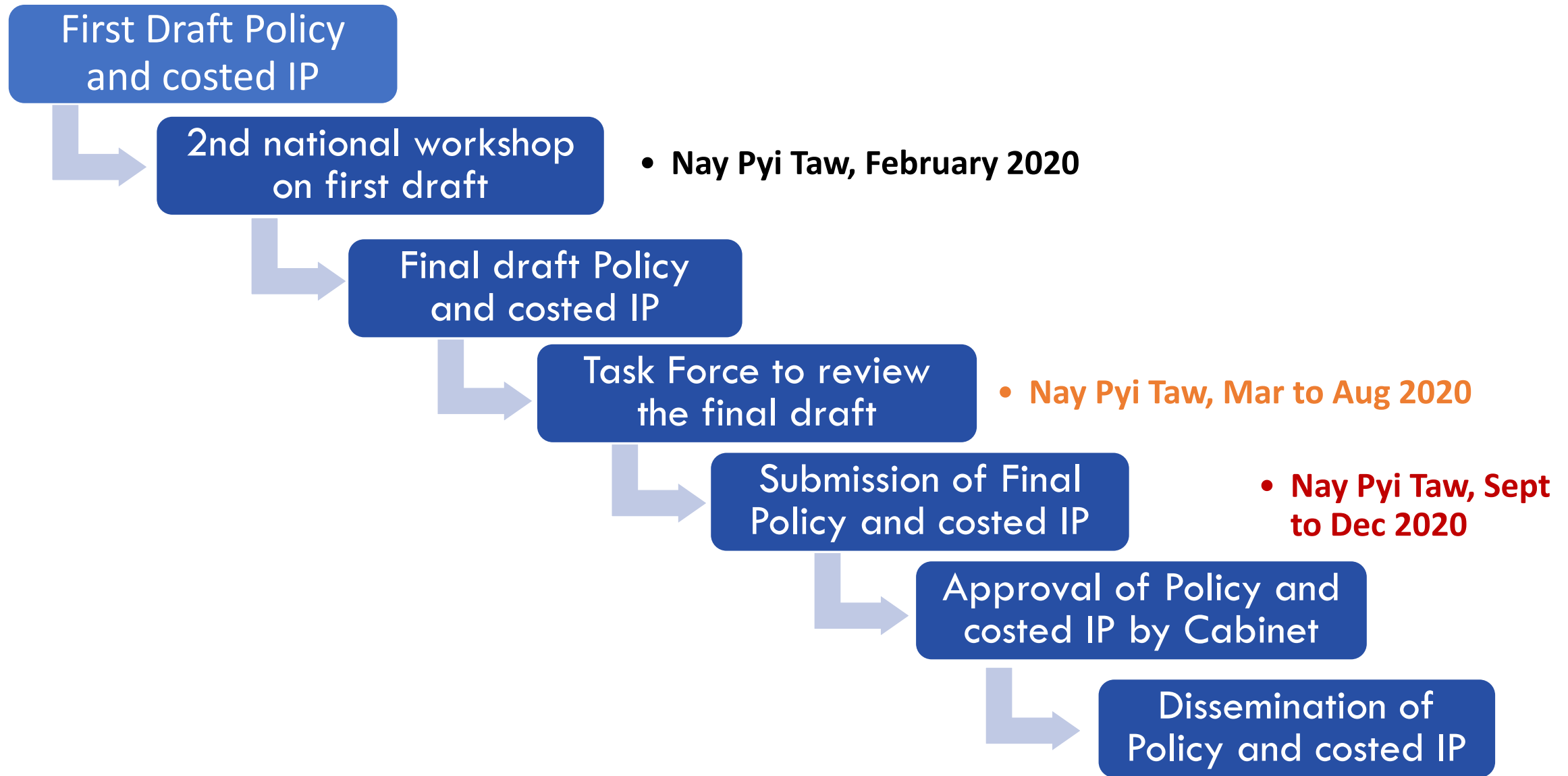
Stakeholder consultations
